- Serve as preceptor for IPPE, Co-Op, and APPE students
- Design and lead a pharmacy-based patient care research project

## **Candidate Requirements**

- Doctor of Pharmacy degree from a college or school of pharmacy accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education

- Submission of residency application materials to Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service (PhORCAS)
  - Completed application
  - Curriculum Vitae
  - Three professional letters of recommendation
  - A letter of intent explaining why you are pursuing a community pharmacy residency and what you hope to gain from the residency program
  - Official university transcripts
- Massachusetts pharmacist license within 60 days of the start of the residency program

Completed application and all accompanying materials must be received no later than January 6<sup>th</sup>, 2017.
