



Walgreens and Midwestern University College of Pharmacy-Glendale PGY1 Community-Based Pharmacy Residency Program, Phoenix, Arizona

The purpose of the Walgreens Community Pharmacy Residency Program is to prepare clinicians to provide direct patient care services as community or ambulatory care pharmacists, in addition to preparing them for an adjunct faculty position. Residents will be enabled to achieve their professional goals, become a leader within the profession, provide compassionate care for members in their community, and contribute to the Walgreen Company's mission of advancing community pharmacy practice.

The residency experience is based in Phoenix, AZ at a URAC accredited Community Walgreens specialty pharmacy that is an innovative community pharmacy practice dedicated to providing clinical patient care services and is an ideal setting for the development of patient care programs. Residents in this setting will have a direct influence on patient outcomes through participation in patient counseling, immunization services, and medication therapy management. The resident will be involved in management of limited distribution medication and required clinical documentation. Residents will also work under a collaborative practice disease state management agreement to provide pharmacist-delivered patient care in an ambulatory care environment. The resident will spend one day a week at Village Medical primary care clinic working with the ambulatory care pharmacist to provide patient education, provide recommendations to providers, and alter medication therapy as needed.

The residency is academically affiliated and financial supported, in part, by Midwestern University College of Pharmacy-Glendale. The resident will complete a teaching certificate program and will actively participate in teaching and precepting experiences at the College.

Residency Activities

- Direct patient care delivered in both community pharmacy settings and primary care clinics
- Public health activities: community outreach programs
- Development of collaborative program to improve adherence and/or outcomes
- Medication therapy management
- Disease state management programs
- Provide health testing services
- Administer immunizations
- Develop or enhance existing patient care programs
- Complete a Teaching Certificate Program
- Provide clinical instruction and serve as a preceptor to student pharmacists
- Design and conduct a practice based research project
- Present research project findings at appropriate regional and national professional conferences

Residency Program Benefits

- Travel allowance for pharmacy-related conferences
- Paid Time Off (PTO)-Resident pharmacists may accrue approximately 10 days depending on average hours worked and time in position

Candidate Requirements

- Doctor of Pharmacy degree from a college or school of pharmacy accredited by ACPE
- Arizona pharmacist license within 90 days of the start of the residency program

- Submission of all the residency application materials by **January 10th** to PhORCAS
 - Curriculum Vitae
 - Three professional letters of recommendation
 - Official university transcripts
 - Letter of intent (explain reason for pursuing a community pharmacy residency and what you hope to gain from the program)
- Virtual or On-site interview (upon invitation)
- Presentation at on-site interview (topic related to community pharmacy)
