

DXC Technology is aware of reports of job seekers receiving fraudulent job confirmation letters via email, unsolicited job postings, Google email chat, Facebook conversations, and other means. These letters erroneously claim to offer employment by DXC for positions that do not exist.

Some of these fraudulent confirmation letters purportedly identify DXC executives, directors, managers or others as senders. Some also include phone numbers, and potential applicants have been encouraged to call in pursuit of job opportunities. These emails and other materials solicit personal information and sometimes money.

People making these or other similar false offers of employment are not affiliated with DXC in any way. The messages were sent without DXC's knowledge or approval. We urge you to report this activity to the office of your state or local government's attorney general, the Internet Crime Complaint Center at www.ic3.gov, or the U.S. Department of Justice at www.stopfraud.gov.
