Why We Need Our Food Service Associates

Our Food Service Associates provide excellent customer service and ensure patient safety through following high-quality standards and safety protocols. Food Service Associates take food orders and prepare meals for patients, family members, and associates. Some of these associates also deliver trays to patient rooms.

Our Food Service Associates must be able to pay attention to detail and take extra care when preparing and delivering meals to patients as some patients have specific dietary requirements.

In addition to our hospital locations, Bon Secours also includes administrative and physician offices, long term care, assisted living, and behavioral health facilities. The food services team provides dietary services to all of these locations.



What A Typical Day May Look Like

Our hospitals run 24 hours, 7 days a week, 365 days a year (including weekends and holidays). We offer multiple different shifts and hours to work with various schedules. At Bon Secours our Full-time and Part-time schedules both offer competitive benefit plans. Our Food Service Associates work day, evening, and/or night shifts. In some of our facilities, Bon Secours is able to offer additional incentives including shift differentials for evening and night shifts.
