Public Transport

In Mildura, public transport primarily consists of a bus network managed by Public Transport Victoria and operated by Mildura Bus.

The bus services cover various routes within Mildura and nearby towns such as Red Cliffs, Irymple, and Merbein.

The main bus terminal is located in the Mildura city centre, making it convenient for residents to access different parts of the region. Mildura Airport offers convenient access to the region for both business and leisure travellers. It's equipped with facilities like car rental services, taxi



stands, and parking areas, making it easy for passengers to travel to and from the airport to their final destination in Mildura or surrounding areas.

The closest international airport to Mildura is Tullamarine Airport (also known as Melbourne Airport) in Melbourne, Victoria. Melbourne Airport (IATA code: MEL) is located approximately 550kms southeast of Mildura and serves as a major gateway for international and domestic visitors to the region.



Apex Beach


Located within Apex Park, Apex Beach is a designated swimming area along the Murray River. It's a popular spot during the warmer months for swimming, sunbathing, and water activities.




