

Hospital Medicine APP Fellowship

The Hospital Medicine Fellowship follows a curriculum based on the Society of Hospital Medicine's Core Competencies for Hospital Medicine. Applications are accepted from APRNs (FNP/ACNP/CNS) and PAs. The fellowship prepares APPs to become highly skilled, compassionate, professional, and efficient hospitalist providers. Applicants should be organized and self-motivated with a passion for learning.

Clinical rotations:

- **HMF 101:** Orientation and APP Hospitalist Boot Camp—orients the APP fellow to the program and essential topics including feedback, documentation, common diagnoses, weeklong rotations on the antimicrobial and antithrombosis pharmacy services, and additional days with physical/occupational/speech therapy and physical therapy wound care.
- **HMF 102:** Introduction to the Role of the APP Hospitalist—the APP fellow is introduced to the role of the APP hospitalist primarily on the APP/attending hospital medicine service, with one rotation on a resident medicine ward service. As the APP fellow gradually increases their patient assignment to four, they receive direct oversight from an experienced APP hospitalist and attending physician.
- **HMF 103:** Additional Roles for the APP Hospitalist—introduces the APP fellow to other APP hospitalist roles such as admissions, consults, and overnight cross cover, with additional weeks on the APP/attending hospital medicine service gradually increasing the patient assignment to six and working directly with the attending physician with increasing independence.
- **HMF 104:** Specialties in Hospital Medicine—the APP fellow rotates on commonly encountered specialty services including cardiology, nephrology, oncology, infectious diseases, palliative care, and neurology/stroke.
- **HMF 105:** Refining the APP Hospitalist Role—the APP fellow returns to the APP/attending hospital medicine service, working independently with the attending physician up to a patient assignment of eight. At the end of the fellowship, the APP fellow is ready to practice autonomously in collaboration with an attending physician.

Didactics:

The innovative didactic curriculum runs throughout the year, supplementing clinical experiences, and includes weekly HMF Seminars focused on the [Core Competencies of Hospital Medicine](#). Fellows also participate in a Work-Life Balance series, a Clinical Reasoning course, and a quality improvement practicum.
